3. Unregistered users are shown as '**GUEST**' and may read all postings, but may not contribute. If you would like to register for the forum or use your existing username/password to log in, click the link at top right of the page shown above. Registration will be covered in the next section.
4. To enter a forum, click the link of the forum you want in the left column. Forums are topic specific. Each forum is a 'threaded' discussion, consisting of a 'parent post' where a user makes a comment or poses a question, and messages which reply to the parent in order. When a parent post is made, a new thread is established and the strung-together replies that follow form the elements of a thread.

5. When you enter a forum, you'll be presented with a listing of threads, the user name of the Originator, and the number of replies to the parent post. Click the thread you are interested in, or 'New Topic' to start a new threaded discussion.

- To add a reply to an existing thread, click the thread you are interested in (see above). You'll see the thread detail, consisting of the parent post, all the replies, and a place at the bottom to post a reply. Non-logged in users will see a 'login' link. You must now log in with the Username & password you requested during registration to proceed with your reply.
- Logged-in users will see a reply form like this. Simply fill in your reply in the 'Body' portion of the form and click the 'Reply' button at the bottom. Your reply will now be added to the thread and be visible to other users.

New User Registration

1. Registration is necessary to post to the forums and use the Private Messaging features.
2. Users may register at any time by clicking the 'Login' link at the top right of any Forum screen. The following screen appears:
